




Veterans: Va Needs Better Visibility and Control Over Medical Center Purchases: Psad-81-16

Dimensions: 9.7in. x 7.4in. x 0.1in.GAO reviewed the Veterans Administrations (VA) medical center purchasing practices and made suggestions to improve procurement management as well as reduce operating costs. The VA Marketing Center purchases items that are stored and distributed through supply depots and manages supply schedule contracts for certain medical and food items. These centralized procurement programs give VA medical centers the opportunity to obtain supplies and equipment without having to independently solicit and award contracts. VA medical centers are required to use these programs whenever possible. However, the medical centers still annually purchase items costing millions of dollars from open market vendors. Opportunities for lower prices are being lost because of the VA failure to standardize common items used by medical centers, failure to maintain visibility over most supplies purchased by medical centers, uneconomical purchasing practices of the medical centers, and failure to consolidate purchases within and among medical centers.
