The increased mortality from typhoid fever showed itself in the Borough of Brooklyn. The mortality from measles remained about the same, and the mortality from broncho pneumonia, which affects children mostly, and is often a concomitant of measles, also showed very little change. The effect of the diminished prevalence of influenza was most marked in the lessened mortality from lobar pneumonia, a disease chiefly affecting adults. The diminution of the mortality among infants under two years of age was very slight. while that between two and five years was considerable, due to diminished mortality from scarlet fever, whooping cough and diphtheria, causes affecting chiefly this age group. The greatest decrease in the mortality was evidenced at the age groups above twenty-five...
