The two rules in use for determining the amount of square timber contained in round logs are the Two-thirds Rule and the Inscribed Square Rule. THE TWO-THIRDS RULE. The diameter of the log is taken at its middle point or the diameters of the two ends of the log are averaged. The diameter of the log is reduced one-third to allow for slab and the remaining two-thirds is taken as the width of the square piece which may be hewn or sawn out of the log. The cubic contents of the squared log are then obtained by squaring this Width and multiplying by the length of the log. This rule gives smaller...
